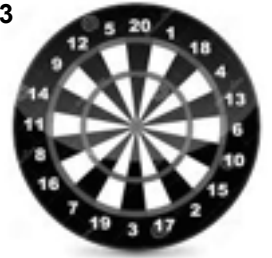

Christoph is a tour guide and speaker who has entertained many local groups with his illustrated talks and walks. He is also Municipal Mace Bearer for Gravesham Borough Council & historical advisor to Swanscombe & Greenhithe Town Council.

OTHER EVENTS OF INTEREST

Gravesend:

An number of properties/venues in the Gravesend area are opening at weekends with either events or tours throughout the next few months. Some have been mentioned in previous editions of Dartboard but here is one more. Luddesdown Church (see www.cobham-luddesdown.org). Also, Gravesham council is preparing a 9 month programme of events marking Pocahontas' journey to Kent 400 years ago but unfortunately at present I can find nothing definite but if any of you can help with information for future editions please email me, details below.

Greenwich:

With this year being the 100th anniversary of The Battle of Jutland there is a new & free exhibition on at the National Maritime Museum to commemorate the largest naval battle of The Great War. The battle took place on the 31st of May 1916 & involved 279 ships of the British Grand Fleet & the German High Seas Fleet where both sides suffered heavy losses but neither side gained a decisive victory. This exhibition is on until the 1st of May next year.

Another new exhibition on at the National Maritime Museum is entitled 'Above & Beyond'. This interactive exhibition has been created in collaboration with NASA & takes visitors on an exciting journey through the past, present & future of aerospace. It is on until the end of August & tickets cost £9 for adults (£7 for concessions & £6 for children) & can be booked online through the museum's website, www.rmg.co.uk.

Sevenoaks:

One of the lesser know National Trust properties in the area, Quebec House at Westerham, will only be open at weekends throughout most of the summer while vital conservation work is carried out. However the house, childhood home of General James Wolfe, will be hosting several events including guided tours when it open to visitors on Saturdays & Sundays, 12-5pm. EDEN VALLEY MUSEUM, 72 HIGH STREET, EDENBRIDGE

Housed in a medieval building, I have recently been given information about this local museum & received a suggestion that the Society could organise a group visit.
