





OUR TALK TODAY RATION BOOK BRITAIN TONI MOUNT

Toni went to Gravesend Grammar School for Girls and lives locally; her first history book was published by Amberley Publishing in 2014 and was about everyday life in medieval London. She has now established an enviable reputation in this field, speaking at many events across the country on this and her other specialities, including the history of ordinary women, medieval housewives and medieval medicine.

In 2016 her hugely successful debut novel *The Colour of Poison*, a thrilling murder mystery set in medieval London was published by MadeGlobal Publishing. This has recently been followed with the second story in the series *The Colour of Gold*. Toni currently has ten books in print and teaches weekly history classes to adults in Gravesend and Rochester.

The launch of her next novel *The Colour of Cold Blood* will be at Gravesend Library on 22 March and is open to the public, but numbers are limited; anyone interested should book their place by emailing gravesendlibrary@kent.gov.uk

Like the Edenbridge visit you will be expected to make your own way to the arranged meeting points but more information will be given when details are being finalised. 2017 ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING & FAMILY HISTORY DAY

This year's AGM will be held on Saturday the 22nd April 2017 at 12 noon at West Heath School, Ashgrove Road, Sevenoaks, Kent, TN13 1SR. Inside December 2016's journal, printed on green paper, are the programme for the day, the agenda for the meeting along with more information & booking form. Although tea & coffee will be available at the start of the day, lunch & an afternoon cream tea must be booked & paid for in advance by using the same booking form. The booking form must be returned before the 28th February. You are welcome to bring your own lunches but the booking form must still be completed & returned so the organisers know how many chairs to provide.

The booking form is also available to print on the NWKFHS website. Follow the links from the front page of both the programme for the day & the meeting agenda.

The origins of West Heath School started when the Reverend Philip Bennet Power & his wife decided to educate their daughters themselves at their home, West Heath, in Abbey Wood. This proved so successful that they officially opened it as a school in 1865. Expanding quickly it moved to Ham, Surrey before returning to Kent & its present site, the 18th century former Ashgrove House in 1932 & taking with it the name of the New School at West Heath, or just West Heath School.

OTHER SOURCES & SOCIETIES

Inspired by February's guest speaker, Chris Bull, the Dartford Historical & Antiquarian Society is this month's highlighted society. It was started in 1910 with an initial membership 12 & a purpose 'to encourage the study of local antiquities & to examine & record as far as possible all evidence of historic & prehistoric remains of antiquarian interest within the district'. It quickly grew & within a year had over 100 members, including the Archbishop of Canterbury. In its early years it undertook archaeological investigations at Henry VIII's Manor House in Priory Road, & various sites around Dartford, & became affiliated to the Kent Archaeological Society. Although it does not do fieldwork any more it does undertake photographic & other historical surveys to preserve what is left of Dartford's ancient buildings. Since 1964 regular newsletters have been published which contains varied selection of historical & archaeological research notes. Copies are available in Dartford library.

With an annual subscription of only £10 it has a programme of winter meetings with guest speakers & organised trips during the summer months.

Meetings are held on the 3rd Friday of the month at the Mick Jagger Centre, The Grammar School (boys), Shepherds Lane Dartford & doors open at 7.30pm for a 7.45pm start. A small point of note: our own Janet is their Lecture Secretary & organises the programme of events.
