Seminar - The Day Parliament Burned Down
At London Metropolitan Archives, 6 September, 6.30 pm

In the early evening of 16 October 1834 a huge ball of fire exploded through the roof of the Houses of Parliament leaving witnesses horrified. The fire led to many changes, not just for Parliament but for many other institutions. Of particular interest to archive users and record keeping professionals is the impact of the fire on the public records (it led directly to the creation of the Public Record Office).

Come along to this talk by Caroline Shenton, Clerk of the Records at the Parliamentary Archives, to find out more about this fascinating story.
