Saturday, 12 October 10:30 - 13:00 Brickwalls and Lost Ancestors

Even the luckiest of family historians comes up against brick walls from time to time.

Dave Annal shows that almost everyone leaves a paper trail and that it's usually possible to find it. He introduces a number of strategies to help you get around the brick walls and dead ends in your research. He pays particular attention to getting the most out of online databases and advanced techniques, such as 'family reconstruction'.

Saturday, 12 October 14:00 - 17:00 How our Ancestors Died

For family historians, it isn't just about finding a date of death for an ancestor. It's also about the cause of the person's death, the location and any treatment

Dr Simon Wills discusses some of the diseases and incidents that caused our ancestors' deaths. He explains why those causes are so different from ones that affect us in the modern world.

He covers:

- How doctors in the past struggled to understand and treat disease;
- The aspects of life in the past that increased the likelihood of an early death;
- Some of the less well-known sources that can help you find out about the deaths of named people in your family tree.
