For our October meeting a small group of members decided to enjoy a last day trip before the clocks go back, managing to pack in visits to the Museum, the Guildhall, the Library and St Lawrence Jewry Church. We even managed to have lunch in a very busy Pret a Manger nearby.

The Police Museum was very interesting, showing the development of the modern police force through historic exhibits and helpful point and press audio guides. The City Police were involved in some famous events - the murder of one of the Ripper victims, the Houndsditch Murders and the Siege of Sidney Street,

as well as later events such as the Moorgate Crash and the IRA bombing campaign.

The Guildhall Library is well worth a visit, especially if you have London and Middlesex ancestors, with a comprehensive collection of books and multi-media material, and also allows free access to Ancestry, Find My Past, and the British Newspaper Archive.

We will continue our programme of occasional visits in the spring of next year, and Lynne is already compiling a list of places that the group want to visit.

### **Saturday, 9 November 10:30 - 13:00 Research Techniques - How to be Confident in your Family Tree**

It is almost too easy to start researching your family tree nowadays. Commercial companies tell us "put in a name and see what you will uncover". Is it that easy? How do you know your family tree is correct, do you believe the family trees you find online, are there no other possibilities for the father of John Hopkins?

In this half day course Karen Cummings demonstrates how to research your family tree the way the professionals do, how to have confidence in your family tree. The first session will focus on getting organised from the outset and making good notes, and in particular noting when something is uncertain.

**The second session** will look at what to do when you run into problems, using examples from the records of civil registration and census records to demonstrate how to overcome perceived hurdles, what other records can be considered and thinking around the problem.

### **Wednesday, 13 November 14:00 – 15:00 Suicide in the Family?**

Attitudes to suicide have changed over the centuries, yet the subject is still surrounded by shame and guilt. A suicide is often hushed up in a family.

Kathy Chater examines the way suicide was perceived in the past and how this has affected what records were kept. Kathy also provides ways to find out whether an ancestor who disappeared in mysterious circumstances might have killed him or herself. In addition, Kathy shares some new insights that may cast light on why people in the past might have taken their own lives.

### **Friday, 15 November 11:00 - 14:00 Visit: Bethlem Museum of the Mind**

Bethlem Royal Hospital was founded in 1247 and was the first institution in the UK to specialise in the care of the mentally ill. The hospital continues to provide in-patient care as part of the South London and Maudsley NHS Foundation Trust, and has been based in south London since 1930. Situated within the 270-acre hospital grounds, in a stunning Art Deco building shared with the Bethlem Gallery, Bethlem Museum of the Mind was formally opened by artist Grayson Perry in March 2015. The Museum cares for an internationally renowned collection of archives, art and historic objects, which together offer an unparalleled resource to support the history of mental healthcare and treatment.
