

Mike Brown

Mike Brown was head of history in a London comprehensive school who, in the absence of a book about the Home Front for his pupils, decided to write one. Since then he has had around thirty more books on twentieth century history published.

Mike & his wife Carol Harris give talks at schools, museums, clubs, & other venues. They have appeared on radio and television, including Time Team, Timewatch, & (most impressive of all for his pupils), Richard and Judy. Recently they have worked on the series 'Ration Book Britain', 'Heir Hunters', 'Love on VE Day' & 'the German are Coming'

They live in South-east London. Mike retired from teaching in 2010, & now works full time writing, giving talks & doing research.

LIBRARY WINDOW DISPLAY

The Library Committee are proposing the idea that any member of the Society could display the results of their family history research at the Joydens Wood Library Window.

The plan is for them show pictures maps & documents that refer to their research to tell the story of an ancestor. The Society will pay for the pictures to be laminated & give assistance with mounting the display on the backboards. The method of attachment uses Velcro tape. Any member who wants to take up this challenge can ask for help from some of the Library experts. If a member would prefer to prepare a display on a subject rather than their family this can be done. A suggested subject would be the work & tools of a trade or occupation, such as a 'Tailor' or
