Our opening photos today were kindly supplied by member Gillian Häkli in Finland, who writes:

## Manor Farm House, Longfield, Kent

On the top is Manor Farm House in the mid-1800s. Known then as Longfield Hill Farm, it was the home of my great-grandfather, John DOHERTY, his wife Elizabeth née BLUNDEN, and their 11 children: Ellen born 1841, Martha 1843, Alexander 1846, Octavius or "Octie" 1848, Thomas Wells 1849, Alice 1852, my grandfather Edward 1854, William Pemble 1855, Frances "Fanny" 1857, Archibald 1859 and Agnes 1861.

The second photo is the house as it is today – remarkably little changed at first glance. To the left, however, there is now a large building works, so the immediate vicinity has changed fairly drastically.

John Doherty had been employed as a chainman by the Royal Engineers when they were mapping his home county of Donegal, and returned with them to Chatham on completion of the survey in 1834.

In Kent, he married Elizabeth Blunden, the daughter of William Blunden, a yeoman of Mereworth, and set up as a grocer in Ightham. By the mid 1840s he and Elizabeth had moved to Longfield Hill Farm, where he took up the more lucrative occupation of hop farming. In this he prospered and was able to buy extensive lands back in his native Donegal though he remained a tenant of the ANDRUS family in Kent.

Longfield Hill Farm was to be his home until his death in 1889.

Joanna Friel, Heritage Rep of The Chislehurst Society, is our Guest Speaker today. Her illustrated talk is about the impact on Chislehurst when Napoleon III sought

When Napoleon III and his family were expelled from France in 1871 after the country's defeat in the Franco-Prussian War, the imperial family moved to Camden Place, Chislehurst. Napoleon died in 1873 and was buried at the Roman Catholic church in Chislehurst until the Empress Eugenie removed his body to Farnborough, Hampshire.

#### Thinking ahead to when I will be 'the ancestor'

This year I particularly thought around the future, when I will be someone's ancestor and that:-

- many digital images we take these days don't get printed
- in my case anyway, many of the few vintage photos we inherit or find after our parents' death are not labelled.

So this year, in my cards to more distant family members and family friends, I enclosed a couple of recent photos of my family at special occasions, fully labelled on the reverse with the date, occasion and names and years of birth of the subjects, and their relationship to each other.

My hope is that if / when someone (perhaps the child or grandchild of the original recipient) finds these photos in a shoe-box in the distant future the photos will provide interesting family information, rather than create a mystery.

Thanks to ideas from member Judith French at the last discussion group, a new series of posters has been produced. #### Easyfundraising

## Volunteers

The last time I tried to count up, there were over 100 volunteers giving their time freely and out of goodwill to help run the Society. They are motivated by a desire to help and contribute to the Society's aims.

We are in particular need of a Society Secretary and an Events Co-ordinator.  $\label{eq:condition}$ 

The Secretary attends the Executive Committee meetings (6 per year) and the AGM and types up the Minutes. The role also involves liaising between the trustees and dealing with post and email - very little and often interesting to deal with.

Events Co-ordinator refers to external events where we have been asked to provide and staff an information table to showcase the Society. The Co-ordinator will liaise with the external event arrangers and decide if the Society can help, co-coordinating a rota of helpers and arranging for any material eg membership forms and goody bags to be transported to the site.
