# The family history show RootsTech London will be at the Excel Centre London England 24 – 26 October 2019

RootsTech is a 3-day event with over 150 breakout sessions / lectures, an exciting line-up of celebrity speakers, and a gigantic exhibition hall. RootsTech sessions include topics such as DNA, how to restore photographs, recording family memories, and how to research your family in historical records. It has attracted world-famous speakers such as Donny Osmond (who will also sing some of his songs), Nick Barrett and many more.

### Tom Doig will talk about Old Photographs, their identification and dating

In earlier times photographs were expensive, and so only taken, if taken at all, on important occasions, such as coming of age, engagement, to show off a uniform, emigration or wedding anniversaries. Tom will explain how we can look for clues to help identify and date them.

Tom Doig is a qualified engineer, teacher and social historian researching rural life in the 19th and 20th centuries. He has written books on local history, has been in radio and television programmes and has lectured widely in the UK and abroad.
