7:00pm for 7:30pm. Guest Speaker Jackie Depelle will explain the value of wills in family history.

Wills are perhaps the most useful source after certificates and censuses. Wills are a personal insight into relationships and possessions. Find indexes and associated records and read the documents. Learn how to exploit them.

(Readers abroad may not know that England and Wales Wills which have been probated, from 1858 to date, can be purchased, and downloaded a few days later, for £1.50 from https://probatesearch.service.gov.uk/#wills)

Jackie Depelle is a specialist Family History tutor, guiding and motivating family history research for just over twenty years.

A regular virtual speaker at shows and to groups across the country, Jackie supports Family and Local History and the Guild of One Name Studies through membership and via her former role as Chairman of the Yorkshire Group of Family History Societies. The Church of England has partnered with Cumbrian-based surveying company Atlantic Geomatics who will use back-pack mounted laser scanners to quickly and accurately map churchyards. They will also photograph all the visible headstones.

There are around 19,000 Anglican burial grounds in England, and the ambitious scheme will aim to digitally survey the majority over the coming seven years. Data on burials will be combined with other information, such as the National Biodiversity Network Atlas, to present the most complete picture of churchyards to date.

The project will come at no cost to parishes or dioceses in the Church of England and parishes will have free access to the map through a new web-based record system which is set to launch in Spring 2022. There will also be the option to subscribe to additional services.

Joseph Cook - the Parish of Mottram Mary Faulkener - this Parish Notes: refused marriage till the day following for very bad behaviour viz After the words '*With this ring I thee wed*', he said *and with my fist I'll break thy head* [written at bottom of entry and marriage crossed out; entry number 546 repeated in register by mistake] Register: Marriages 1778 - 1802, Page 139, Entry 546
