OUR TALK TODAY, THE 6th NOVEMBER 2021 'SCHOOLGIRL'S WAR'

MARY SMITH

Mary Smith, former head of Maidstone Girls' Grammar School, retired in 2014 after eight years. As well as this talk, Mary produced a book with the same title, both having their origins in discoveries made at the school: the entrance to an underground shelter & the revelation of finding it was a time capsule of a classroom used during the air raids, & a comprehensive & beautifully illustrated diary by the then art teacher, Helen Keen.

This talk includes fascinating & often surprising recollections from past pupils, now in their 80s & 90s. Although it focuses on one school, the experiences were common to schools across Kent &, perhaps, the lives of some Friends. The reason this story is unique is the quality of the records, particularly these beautiful paintings, that have been preserved at the school.
