## The Cook Family on the beach at Sandown, Isle of Wight, 1913

This lovely family photo has kindly been sent in by member Angela Brandreth-Cook.

I send the attached photo, taken by an itinerant photographer on the beach at Sandown, IoW.

The pipe smoking young man on the right is my father, Esmond Barnaby **COOK** (1892-1946), aged 21.

The woman on the left is my grandmother, Laura Elizabeth Cook nee **CHANDLER**. (1869-1959) with my aunt Chris on her lap. The photographer asked her to move further in, as he couldn't get everyone in the shot, so that is what Auntie Chris (Christine Mary Cook 1894-1984) did!

The boy in front of Grandma is my uncle Cecil (Cecil Barnaby Cook 1898 - 20 August 1917) aged thirteen. He died in WW1 when the Sopwith Pup he was flying broke up when he was coming in to land it. He was just eighteen. <u>https://livesofthefirstworldwar.iwm.org.uk/lifestory/6841405</u>

The three people in the middle of the picture are most probably cousins, but I cannot say with certainty who they are. The lady in the flowery hat on the extreme right is likely to be a sister of my grandma, but again, I can't say for sure.

#### The Shetland Bus WWII with Guest Speaker Gilly Halcrow

# Thursday 14 July; a Sevenoaks Branch Meeting at Otford Village Memorial Hall, 28a High Street, Otford TN14 5PQ Doors Open 7.15pm meeting starts 8.00pm and will finish by 9.30pm

Gilly's talk tells the story of the brave Norwegian sailors in their fishing boats who kept links open between occupied Norway and Britain during WWII, taking agents in with supplies for the resistance and escaping refugees out.

Not only did they have to face sub-Arctic storms in the North Sea but also the might of the Nazi war machine searching for them.

This fascinating talk details the deeds of incredibly courageous and patriotic men. The seas between Norway and Scotland are the stormiest in the world. No other series of journeys in such bad weather, in such small boats and in darkness to an unlit coast had been undertaken.

The impact of the operation resulted in 400 tons of arms and explosives being delivered, 450 refugees rescued and many agents being delivered and recovered.

Gilly's talk is a moving account of what affectionately became known as 'The Shetland Bus'; helping Norway to bring back its peace and pride.

There were many acts of outstanding courage and incredible bravery performed during the Shetland Bus operation. To commemorate this, a wreath laying ceremony is held annually on 17th May in Shetland. Norway still send Christmas trees to London and Edinburgh in gratitude for our assistance.

## The 9 lives of Mina Jury with Guest Speaker Claire Moores

Claire Moores is an independent history researcher with over 20 years experience of genealogical and local historical research projects.

Mina Jury was transported to Van Dieman's land age 17 for stealing some jewellery from her employer. After she got her ticket of leave she married and had 11 children. However, after her husband's death she then returned to England to appear as a minor witness in the trial of the Tichborne Claimant in 1873. Uprooted from the stable life she had created in Australia, Mina went on to live a life of theft and fraud in England.
