Warriers at heart, the popular and not inaccurate view of the Vikings is of thuggish invaders and ferocious fighters. Whilst it's always acknowledged that they were also masters of navigation and sea-faring and were great traders, not much attention is paid to their culture and how some of it influenced later church art in Britain.

Their religious beliefs worked seamlessly with their legends so sometimes the two are hard to separate. Sagas tell of heroic deeds by both man and monster, whilst others unintentionally show the nuts and bolts of Scandinavian society. Skaldic poetry with its strange metaphors is more specific – deliberately so – composed so that it couldn't be altered by future generations and so the story couldn't be lost.





Dartford Branch Talk: *Towers of Strength* - The Martello Towers of England with David Sleep

### Saturday 5 November: Doors Open 9.45am meeting starts 10.30am and will end by 12.30pm

Dartford Science and Technology College, Heath Lane, Dartford Kent DA1 2LY

Many will remember the Martello Towers from their seaside holidays and David will explain how they were part of a revolution in English defense against the French.

He became fascinated by the towers as a child when his parents took him and his sisters on trips to places such as Dymchurch, and he has visited most of the towers still standing.

They were part of the fortifications built in the early 1800s to prevent an invasion by Napoleon.

Martello towers stand up to 40 feet (12 m) high (with two floors) and typically had a garrison of one officer and 15–25 men. Their round structure and thick walls of solid masonry made them resistant to cannon fire, while their height made them an ideal platform for a single heavy artillery, mounted on the flat roof and able to fire, over a complete 360° circle. A few towers had moats or other batteries and works attached for extra defence.

The Martello towers eventually became obsolete but many have survived to the present day, often preserved as historic monuments.

There is a large, free car park but it is shared with other users and can be busy at times. No booking, just turn up.

Cousins can contact each other via the website - although you can of course subsequently exchange email addresses.
