

Dartford Branch Talk: *Towers of Strength* - The Martello Towers of England with David Sleep

Saturday 5 November: Doors Open 9.45am meeting starts 10.30am and will end by 12.30pm Dartford Science and Technology College, Heath Lane, Dartford Kent DA1 2LY

Many will remember the Martello Towers from their seaside holidays and David will explain how they were part of a revolution in English defense against the French.

He became fascinated by the towers as a child when his parents took him and his sisters on trips to places such as Dymchurch, and he has visited most of the towers still standing.

They were part of the fortifications built in the early 1800s to prevent an invasion by Napoleon.

Martello towers stand up to 40 feet (12 m) high (with two floors) and typically had a garrison of one officer and 15–25 men. Their round structure and thick walls of solid masonry made them resistant to cannon fire, while their height made them an ideal platform for a single heavy artillery, mounted on the flat roof and able to fire, over a complete 360° circle. A few towers had moats or other batteries and works attached for extra defence.

The Martello towers eventually became obsolete but many have survived to the present day, often preserved as historic monuments.

There is a large, free car park but it is shared with other users and can be busy at times.

Standard membership is free and includes the opportunity to receive Peter's free LostCousins informative e newsletter distributed 2-3 times a month.

Members add ancestors onto their LostCousins *My Ancestors* page using Census entries as their source. (When getting started it's recommended that you use the freely available 1881 Census.)

Then press the Search button and LostCousins automated matching will flag up if another member has entered the same ancestor (in which case you're related, you are each others' 'lost cousins').

Cousins can contact each other via the website - although you can of course subsequently exchange email addresses.

Peter has kindly agreed that the talk can be recorded, and so it will be uploaded to the members-only area of nwkfhs.org.uk within a few days of the live Zoom talk.
