
Post Card to Bob Seely, 5 Blandford Road, Beckenham, Kent.


Although the Society Library is open almost every Wednesday from 10am to 4pm, please be aware that on 25 January it won't open til 1pm.

Jenny delivers a fascinating insight into five generations of her family who lived during the days of the British Raj in India.

Seen through the eyes of their granddaughter, Jenny captures a period of British history through her PowerPoint presentations with extensive collection of family sepia photographs, and manages to bring her stories to life: her grandmothers' lives as memsahibs and the "legacy" that Jenny has been given, a 170 year old cookbook penned by Jenny's great 4 x grandmother in 1844 when she was aged just 15 and a newlywed bride, married to an English schoolmaster.

Jenny also describes her grandfathers, uncles and relatives who served in the British Army as early as 1798, The Royal Indian Navy, the Railways in Madras, a co-founder of an English Medium School in India in the early 18th century and a great uncle who rose up through the ranks to become Postmaster General in the telegraph industry.

Now a writer, Jenny has had a successful career at the BBC in television production. She lives in Kingsclere, Hampshire with Stewart, her husband of over 30 years, their Westie dog, and their three cats. Any spare time that she has is spent doing painting, home decorating, jewellery making, listening to music, photography and enjoying nature.

Jenny has travelled extensively throughout India and has also visited many other countries, including Hong Kong, Japan, Australia, and America. Her travelogues and written anecdotes of her journeys are much enjoyed by her family and friends.

A collection of talks based on generations of her British Raj Family with fascinating sepia photographs and interesting facts about the history of the infrastructure of India.

Mission to England: reinvestigating the origins of St. Augustine's Abbey.



Mission to England: re-investigating the origins of St. Augustine's Abbey

Summary: Although today dominated by the impressive ruins of its medieval abbey, St. Augustine's Abbey – part of the Canterbury UNESCO Word Heritage site – was the base for the late sixth-century Papal mission to Kent, which led ultimately to the establishment the English Church.

While pivotal in the later development of English religious and political life, culture and even architecture, most of what is published about the earliest phases of St. Augustine's derives from early 20th-century excavations and little attention has been paid to what was at the site prior to the arrival of the missionaries in 597.

Beginning in 2019, the 'Mission to England' project – established and directed by the speaker – seeks to employ 21st-century archaeological methods to enhance understanding of the origins and earliest development of the site, building on the contributions of all its earlier investigators.

The first part of the project's work, at the Chapel of St. Pancras, has already identified what may well be the earliest known 'Anglo-Saxon' church building in Britain – and the only one which may have been commissioned, consecrated, and used by the leader of the Papal mission, St. Augustine of Canterbury.
