Society Library: The Society Library has long been back to pre Covid opening arrangements, open every Wednesday from 10am to 4pm for members to do their own research, socialise, participate in library based workshops and discussion groups and receive help from the library volunteers.

There's no need to book just to use the library resources, but booking to attend workshops and other groups is essential.

You can use the library's PCs to access Ancestry - and FindMyPast which currently includes access to the 1921 census. We suggest joining Kent Libraries as you can then access these websites from your own device whilst in the library which eases pressure on the library PCs.

We'd previously said it would have to open late on 26 July but I'm pleased to advise that is no longer the case, it will open at its usual time of 10am and library volunteers will be waiting to welcome members and assist with your research.

Dartford Branch Talk: *Lost Rivers of London* with Roger Squires

Saturday 5 August: Doors Open 9.45am meeting starts 10.30am and will end by 12.30pm

Many members will have had family who lived in or passed through London in the past. They would have been familiar with the many rivers which are no longer visible above ground but which were part of daily life and often carried effluent into the River Thames.

Roger will tell us about these tributaries which still do flow but are now covered, hence the term "lost rivers". He will explain how there are still clues to following the routes of these rivers thereby enhancing our understanding of where and how our ancestors lived.

Sevenoaks Branch Talk: *The Pre - Raphaelite Brotherhood* with Delia Taylor

Saturday 12 August Doors open 10.45am meeting starts 11am

Delia has been a public speaker for over 15 years and North West Kent FHS members have already enjoyed several of her talks.

This talk is a feast for the eyes. We look at the formation of the Pre-Raphaelite Brotherhood and at the paintings which made them famous.

The brotherhood led to the Arts and Craft Movement in which William Morris, a great friend of the members, embraced their art through textiles and wallpaper. Eventually it became so popular that it was copied by architects, jewellers, interior and fashion designers and evolved into the style known as Art Nouveau.

Delia's talk is comprehensively illustrated with audio-visual clips.

No booking, just turn up. Free to members. A donation towards hall hire and speaker fee is appreciated from visitors.
