### **Dartford Branch November Talk: *Postman's Park* with Dr John Price**

### **Saturday 2 November: Doors Open 9.45am Meeting starts 10.30am Dartford Science and Technology College, Heath Lane, Dartford Kent DA1 2LY**

Postman's Park, so called because of its proximity to London's main Post Office and popularity with the postal workers who came here to eat their lunchtime sandwiches, was opened in 1880.

In 1887 G.F. Watts, the artist, put forward the idea of a national memorial to heroic men and women. A wall in the Park was dedicated to this cause in 1900.

Dr Price is a Senior Lecturer in Modern British History at Goldsmiths and is an expert in civilian heroism and self sacrifice in the 19th and early 20th centuries and has made a study of those commemorated in Postman's Park. Their stories are fascinating and Dr Price is an accomplished speaker.

The talks venue has a large, free car park but it is shared with other users and can be busy at times.

No booking, just turn up. Free to members. A donation towards hall hire and speaker fee is appreciated from visitors.

## Society Library

The Society Library is open every Wednesday for members to do their own research, socialise, participate in library based workshops and discussion groups and receive help from the library volunteers.

You can use the library's PCs to access Ancestry - and FindMyPast (which currently does NOT include access to the 1921 census, something we are investigating with the library). We suggest joining Kent Libraries as you can then access these websites from your own device whilst in the library which eases pressure on the demand for library PCs.

Non members, on Wednesdays you can join the Society at the library. 80 Summerhouse Drive, Joydens Wood, Bexley Kent DA5 2EE Free parking in nearby side roads.

The library is open from 10am to 4pm but it greatly helps the volunteers if visitors with research queries call in earlier in the day rather than later. Please also bring as much information as you already have about the ancestor you are researching.

Advance Notice for Library Visitors: on Wednesday 27 November between 10am and 2pm it will not be possible to access the books held by the Society as they are stored in a room which will be in use for a meeting.

### <https://archives.coram.org.uk/>

**Coram's Foundling Hospital Archive** is a unique and rich historical resource which spans the full history of the Foundling Hospital, from 1739 to 1954, when the residential school closed.

The half-million records detail the lives of the 27,000 children in the Hospital's care, their mothers' circumstances, and the Hospital's operation and guiding principles. In addition, the archive is a significant source for social history, women's history, and regional English history, as well as the history of apprenticeships, medicine, textiles, and more.

To make this important resource widely available, Coram has digitised and transcribed 405 volumes dating from 1739 to 1899. **Nearly 100,000 pages, or 23% of the entire archive, can now be viewed online – for free. These records document the lives of 22,031 Foundlings and 823 London Parish children.**
